

# metronidazole and seizure disorder

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Most canines who develop neurologic signs secondary to metronidazole administration have received weeks to months of therapy, but toxicity after short-term therapy at relatively low dosages. In general, higher dosages may produce signs in a shorter time period than moderate to low dosages. It is commonly prescribed in the treatment of inflammatory bowel disease, gastritis associated with helicobacter, giardiasis and empirical treatment of diarrhea. This retrospective, case series study aimed to describe thoracic computed tomographic CT findings for a group of dogs with confirmed crenosomosis. Adverse effects in dogs and cats include neurologic disorders, lethargy, weakness, neutropenia, hepatotoxicity, hematuria, anorexia, nausea, vomiting and diarrhea.
