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Do not this medication if you are allergic to buspirone, or if you have used an MAO inhibitor such as isocarboxazid Marplan , phenelzine Nardil , rasagiline Azilect , selegiline Eldepryl, Emsam , or tranlycypromine Parnate within the past 14 days. If you have any of these conditions, you may not be able to use buspirone, or you may need a dosage adjustment or special tests during treatment.
