

what is the difference between synthroid and generic synthroid

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How do you know which one is best for you? And there's no predetermined formula to tell which drug will be the best for you, until you try them, find optimal doses, and see how you do over time. Synthroid has regularly claimed to be better than its competitors, but research proved them to be bioequivalent -- or equal, in terms of what function they perform in the body -- to their competition, so this claim of superiority actually has no merit. It is my firm belief that the state of the art in finding the optimal medicine is still trial and error. Sometimes it is the combination of two or three of the above medicines that proves to be the magic solution for a particular person. If I were to tell you that only one drug works for everyone, I would be as narrow-minded and simplistic as the endocrinologists whose slavery to Synthroid I regularly condemn. Some people who are on levothyroxine also need the addition of the second key hormone, triiodothyronine T3. Levoxyl is also fast-dissolving, and should be taken with sufficient water, and swallowed quickly to maximize absorption. Five years after the FDA required all levothyroxine products to file new drug applications, on July 24, , Synthroid finally obtained FDA approval, making it the fourth levothyroxine to obtain the FDA's approval, after the August approval of Unithroid, Levoxyl's May, approval, and Levo-T's approval. Synthroid also tends to be more expensive than the competitive levothyroxine drugs. May 3, - I was taking Synthroid then my insurance decided that they wouldn't cover that drug anymore (only generic) unless the doctor did a lot of paperwork and showed that it was medically necessary. Nov 20, - Many people have no difficulty switching between levothyroxine and Synthroid, but others develop distressing symptoms suggesting a difference in dose. these were patients who were started on the brand-name drug Synthroid and found that their symptoms did not respond in the same way to a generic. Aug 11, - Because there may be subtle differences in bioavailability between Synthroid and levothyroxine, it is preferable to stay with one formulation when possible.
