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You should not use Depakote if you have liver disease, a urea cycle disorder, or a genetic disorder such as Alpers' disease or Alpers-Huttenlocher syndrome especially in a child younger than 2 years old. Divalproex sodium can make you sunburn more easily. Some drugs can raise or lower your blood levels of divalproex sodium, which may cause side effects or Depakote less effective. Swallow this mixture right away. Tell your doctor about all medicines you use, and those you start or stop using. Many drugs can interact with divalproex sodium.
