

# neurontin pharmacological classification

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Usual dosage is to mg P. Increased as needed and tolerated to 1, mg daily, given in three divided doses. Separate administration by at least 2 hours. Over the recommended dose range of to mg t. Women should discontinue breast-feeding because of potential for serious adverse reactions. Overdose and treatment Acute gabapentin overdose may cause double vision, slurred speech, drowsiness, lethargy, and diarrhea. Adjust as needed to a maximum daily dose of 1, mg divided into three doses. Adults and children age 13 and older: Elimination half-life is 5 to 7 hours. Available forms Available by prescription only Capsules: Food may have slight effect on the rate or extent of absorption. Discontinue drug therapy or substitute alternative drug gradually over at least 1 week to minimize risk of seizures. Use cautiously in patients with altered renal function caused by drug accumulation. For patients age 12 and older with compromised renal function and patients receiving hemodialysis, use the dosage guide at the top of the next column. Patients on hemodialysis should receive maintenance doses based on estimates of creatinine clearance as indicated below and a supplemental posthemodialysis dose of to mg administered after each 4 hours of hemodialysis.
