The patent assigns exclusive legal right to the inventor or patent holder, and may include entities such as the drug brand name, trademark, product dosage form, ingredient formulation, or manufacturing process A patent usually expires 20 years from the date of filing, but can be variable based on many factors, including development of new formulations of the original chemical, and patent infringement litigation. Occasionally that might even mean I will move the dose up a little when I switch, although I have not done that yet. One of the ways investigators have tried to compensate for observation bias is to compare rates of return to trade name switching amongst different medications. However, another way to avoid observational bias would simply be to look at actual blood levels of medications before and after a switch to generic. My daughter is 23 yrs old and has been on lamictal for 7 years and all has been perfectly fine. Recently the insurance company would not let her prescription be filled unless she had tried the generic brand name. She started taking the generic brand name Lamitrogine last monday and by Wednesday was having breath. A generic version of Lamictal has been approved by the FDA. However, this does not mean that the product will necessarily be commercially available - possibly because of drug patents and/or drug exclusivity.
