Metoclopramide inhibits dopamine receptors in the chemoreceptor trigger zone of the brain to inhibit or reduce nausea and vomiting. Instruct patient to place tablet on tongue, where it will dissolve in approximately 1 minute, and then swallow saliva. For prevention, single dose of 20 mg some patients may respond to doses as small as 5 mg. Stay signed in for 30 days. Repeat dose q 4 to 6 hours, as needed. May lead to increased CNS depression. Moderate or severe impairment (Child-Pugh class B or C): 5 mg 4 times daily or 10 mg 3 times daily (maximum: 30 mg/day). There is no known treatment for tardive dyskinesia. In some patients, symptoms may lessen or resolve after metoclopramide treatment is stopped. Treatment with metoclopramide for longer than 12 weeks should be avoided in all but rare cases where therapeutic benefit is thought to outweigh the risk of developing tardive.
