Side effects may include: Although there is no evidence to suggest that mefloquine has caused harm to the foetus it should normally be avoided during the first trimester of pregnancy or if pregnancy is considered possible within 3 months of stopping prophylaxis. Your doctor may recommend using a combination of different antimalarials to overcome strains of malaria that have become resistant to single types of medication. One dose should be taken a week before departure and it should be continued throughout exposure and for 4 weeks afterwards, however three 3 doses at weekly intervals prior to departure are advised if the drug has not been used before - this can detect in advance those likely to get side effects so that an alternative can be prescribed. Visit your GP or local travel clinic for malaria advice as soon as you know when and where you're going to be travelling. Pregnant women have an increased risk of developing severe malaria, and both the baby and mother could experience serious complications. If you take doxycycline for acne, it will also provide protection against malaria as long as you're taking an adequate dose.
