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Clozaril can cause severe dizziness, slow heartbeats, fainting, or seizures. May increase total daily dose in increments of 25 mg to 50 mg per day to a target dose of mg to mg per day administered in divided doses by the end of week 2. Call your doctor for medical advice about side effects. If you miss taking Clozaril for more than 2 days in a row, call your doctor before you start taking it again. Your blood will need to be tested often. Always consult your doctor or pharmacist. Dose adjustments may be necessary in patients with concomitant use of: Skip the missed dose if it is almost time for your next scheduled dose. Many drugs can interact with clozapine.
