

# pharmacological classification of neurontin

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Use cautiously in patients with altered renal function caused by drug accumulation. Increased as needed and tolerated to 1, mg daily, given in three divided doses. Discontinue drug therapy or substitute alternative drug gradually over at least 1 week to minimize risk of seizures. Women should discontinue breast-feeding because of potential for serious adverse reactions. Not appreciably metabolized in humans. Elimination half-life is 5 to 7 hours. Drug can be removed from plasma by hemodialysis. Adjust as needed to a maximum daily dose of 1, mg divided into three doses.
